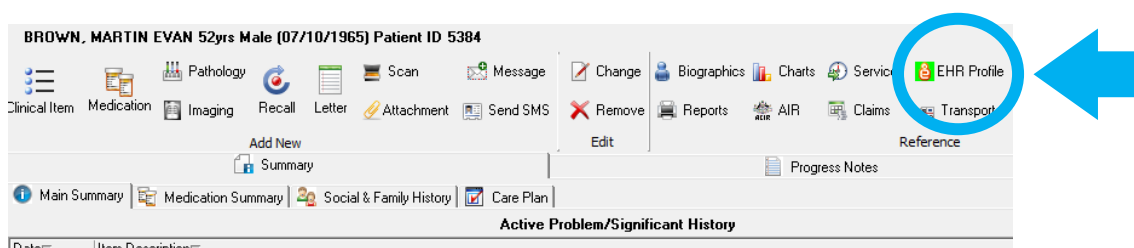

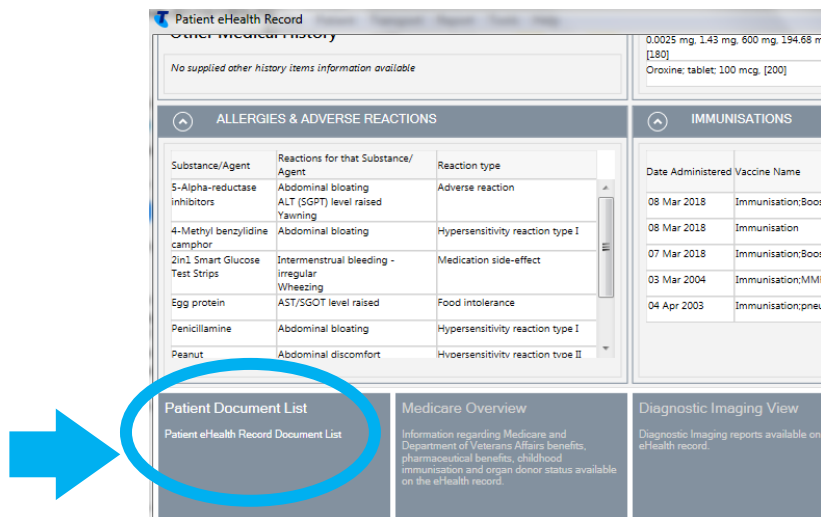
Accessing the Medicines View

Did you know the My Health Record provides a consolidated view of all medicines information from a range of documents uploaded through Clinical Information Systems and patient entered details?

Step 1. From the patient's clinical record in Communicare. Click- **"EHR Profile"** then **"View Health Record Overview"**



Step 2. Scroll down and click **"Patient Document List"**
