03. CQI TIPS:

Continuous Quality Improvement: Looking at what you are doing, identifying areas of improvement, taking action to do it better and reviewing if it worked.

- There are multiple points along the ear disease spectrum in which a CQI activity could be undertaken
- This could be a simple small activity to large project.
- The AMSANT Ear Health and CQI teams can support this process in a variety of ways and we encourage all services to consider undertaking a CQI activity – either big or small – in 2025.

ASK THE EXPERTS If we don't know we will find out!

'I only learnt about ears when I came to the NT. Unless there is obvious signs of infection like pus or bulging, I don't really know what to do'

Knowing the normal, healthy landmarks on the eardrum can help you establish when something is wrong. Testing the ear drum movement with tympanometry can give you even more information.

Things to look for:

04.

- The cone of light reflex, the handle of the malleus and the transparency of the ear drum.
- If you can not see these clearly and you get a flat-line or Type B-tympanometry result, likely the client has Otitis Media with Effusion or Glue Ear (CARPA page 402).
