

## Domestic and Family Violence Risk Assessment and Management Framework

'We all have a responsibility'





- In October 2018, the Northern Territory Government amended the Domestic and Family Violence (DFV) Act by introducing a new DFV Information Sharing Scheme.
- The changes permit information about individuals experiencing or committing domestic and family violence, to be shared without consent in specific circumstances.
- One of the key updates included the Northern Territory
  Government is the being required to develop a
  framework for domestic and family violence risk
  assessment and management.

- A part of NT's Domestic, Family and Sexual Violence Reduction Framework 2018-2028, (the DFSV Framework), is a Comprehensive Risk Assessment Tool (CRAT) which has been developed, and is being implemented.
- The objective of the DFV (RAMF) is to:

- The DFSV Framework aims to hold accountable those who commit domestic and family violence, by establishing a consistent and evidence-based approach to identifying, assessing, responding to, and managing DFV risk.
